Because that's the thing, on those types of cases they're out there trying to gather as much evidence to prosecute, convict, and lock someone up. So knowing what they're doing, I can use those same tools to gather evidence to protect that individual and to keep them from facing harsh prison time, from having to face other consequences that can come from those types of cases.

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There's some real truth to the old axiom that you need to know your enemy. Having been a former prosecutor and seeing things from the other side, you know what the government and the state is going to be trying to do to your client. You know what they're going to be trying to do, how they're going to be trying to bend the law, how they're going to be trying to gather evidence from you. I know what tricks they're going to use. I know how they're going to look at things. And by being able to have that sort of foresight, I can take proactive steps to protect my clients and to advocate for them and their best interests.
